ABOUT THE STORY

DELIGHT IN READING TOGETHER

As you read about Jo's actions, use your voice to highlight the silliness of what Jo is doing. Like many toddlers, Jo isn't trying to be malicious. But his rambunctiousness is getting him in trouble. Your child might be able to empathize!

ABOUT YOUNG CHILDREN AND LYING

Young children often lie because it's easier than telling the truth—especially if the truth is going to get them in trouble or make adults upset. Point out that Jo's friends were grateful when he told the truth, to help your child understand that being honest is always the right thing to do—even when it's hard.

FAITH CONNECTION

"You shall not bear false witness" is one of the Ten Commandments for a reason! Jesus tells us to love each other—and one way we do that is by telling each other the truth in love.
