### Suggested Activities:

The Frolic board books make it easy to talk about faith and growth with your young child. You can expand on the concepts your child is learning with easy follow-up activities. Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- Let your child walk and wiggle as you read. When you get to a part in the story where a character is moving his or her body, encourage your child to do the same—flap their wings like Uri, jump like Jo, or dance like Ava.
- Take some time to look at all the little details on the pages of the book. Count the clouds or identify the colors of the flowers. Count the raindrops or find the berries. These little investigations help your child engage with the story while they learn.
- Take a peek at the back of each board book for a song or game you can play together.
- Expand the world of the book by taking the concept from the story into your everyday adventures. Look for things that are big and things that are little on your next walk. Pray your way through the morning. Notice something you smell, taste, hear, see, and touch in your house or in your neighborhood.
